We aim to give students a competitive edge, to give the chance to become more resilient, show effective communication, organisation and leadership. Every student, regardless of their chosen pathway, will have access to wider enrichment opportunities.

A well organised and relevant work experience placement is a compulsory part of the Sixth Form experience. Students can complete either:

- A weekly work placement for bespoke work experience options
- A voluntary Community Ambassador placement
- A focused work experience week in the summer term (for Year 12 students)

All extra curricula activities are recognised and accredited by Plymouth University.

Students are encouraged to search for places away from Plymouth that are relevant to their chosen vocation. In recent years, higher education institutions have stressed the need for students to have experienced time in a work-based environment where new skills can be developed.

Your Next Steps to Sixth Form

STEP ONE CHOOSE YOUR OPTION

The Sixth Form is a more adult learning environment and the pathways on offer are reflective of this. We enable students to achieve their aspirations by giving students the opportunity to specialise in particular fields or choose a broad programme of study. We have three main options for study.

Option 1:

A Level courses, Level 3 courses that provide students with the subject knowledge and entry level requirements to enter into university or higher level apprenticeships. These subjects are predominantly assessed through exams at the end of Year 13. Subject choices include English Literature & Language, History, Law, Sociology, Biology and Art to name a few!

Option 2:

Our Level 3 BTEC programme is an A Level equivalent route which involves a more hands-on learning experience but provides students with the entry requirements for university or higher level degree apprenticeships. This pathway is assessed through a mixture of coursework and examinations. Examinations can be taken from the summer of Year 12 onwards. Subjects include Business, Engineering, Sport and many more...

Option 3:

A mixed pathway: mix your Level 3 BTEC subject of choice with A Level options to complete a combined programme of study.





Your Next Steps to Sixth Form

Option 1:

A Level route. This is a two-year programme of study, with exams completed at the end of Year 13. The A Levels on offer are:

- · Art, Craft and Design
- Art, Graphic Illustration
- Biology
- Chemistry
- English Literature and Language
- History
- Geography
- Law
- Mathematics
- Photography
- Physics
- Psychology
- Sociology

Option 2:

BTEC route. This is a two-year programme of study assessed through a mixture of assignments and examinations. Examinations can be completed from the summer of Year 12. The BTEC courses on offer are:

- Business Studies
- Engineering
- Health and Social Care
- Sport

We also offer an RSL Performing Arts in either Music or Drama Performance course which is assessed in a similar way to the BTEC courses.

Option 3:

Choose a BTEC subject or two and mix it with an A Level for a combined programme of study.

Entry Requirements: Pathway 1

Option 1:

A Level entrance requirements

Students must have achieved five GCSEs at Grade 5 or above, including Maths and English. A Grade 6 is usually expected in the chosen course. Some individual subjects also have further entrance requirements.

Art and Design - GCSE Art at Grade 4 or above

Biology - Two or more GCSE Sciences at Grade 6 (or, if you are studying triple Science, a Grade 6 in Biology and one other science and least 5 in another) and GCSE Mathematics at Grade 6

Chemistry - GCSE Science at Grade 6 (or, if you are studying triple Science, a Grade 6 in Chemistry and one other science and and least 5 in another) and GCSE Mathematics at Grade 6

Physics - Two or more GCSE Sciences at Grade 6 (or, if you are studying triple Science, a Grade 6 in Physics and one other science and least 5 in another) and GCSE Mathematics at Grade 6

English Literature and Language - GCSE English Literature and Language at Grade 6

Geography - Grade 6 or above in GCSE Geography or Grade 5 in Science if Geography has not been taken previously.

History - GCSE History at Grade 6 or above. For those students who have not taken GCSE History, an English grade of at least a 6 is required

Law - GCSE English Language at Grade 6 or above

Mathematics - GCSE Mathematics at Grade 6 or above

Photography - GCSE Art at Grade 4 or above

Psychology - GCSE grade 5 in Maths and Science

Entry Requirements: Pathway 2 & 3

Option 2:

Level 3 BTEC courses

Students will have achieved five or more GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including English and Maths. Individual subjects may have further subject specific entry requirements.

Business Studies - A range of GCSE grades, at least five grades 9-4 including a 4 in English and Mathematics

Engineering - GCSE Mathematics and Science at Grade 5

Health and Social Care - No additional requirements

Sport - GCSE Physical Education at Grade 4 or above, alternative Level 2 qualification in Sport (at Merit or Distinction level), GCSE Science at Grade 4 or above and GCSE English at Grade 4 or above

Performing Arts Drama - No additional requirements

Performing Arts Music - No additional requirements





The University Scholar Route

Offered in conjuntion with:

Plymouth Marjon University University of Plymouth Exeter University Sutton Trust

Students can choose any combination of subjects from our option blocks. This pathway features specialist programmes with university masterclasses, student shadowing, university visits, university applications, student workshops and summer schools.

This is an open pathway with a variety of opportunities to prepare you for careers in any sector.

What can I expect from this Pathway?


