Post-18 Pathway

Many jobs will require you to have an HE qualification.

For some careers you will need a university degree, but for a large number of others there are many different routes into them.

You have the opportunity to specialise in what you really enjoy or a particular career path.

General Academic

Bachelor's Degree

- Could be single, joint or combined honours
- Usually 3 years, but can be 4
- Studied at a university or college
- Exams, coursework and sometimes a practical assessment
- Some jobs require you to have a Bachelor's Degree





General Academic/ Vocational

Foundation Degrees

- Usually one subject
- A one or two year course
- On some courses you then have the option to do an extra top up year to get a full Bachelor's Degree
- Studied at a university or college and assessed by exams, coursework and practicals





Higher Technical Qualification

- Launched in 2022 L4 and L5 qualifications.
- HNCs, HNDs and Foundation Degrees are assessed against employer developed standards and if approved they have the right to be identified as an HTQ
- Focus on the skills employers are looking for in key job roles – digital, construction, health, education and early years, legal finance and accounting
- Eligible for student funding









Vocational

Higher National Certificate and Diploma

- One or two year course
- Tailored towards specific job roles or career paths
- Practical based courses
- Assessed through assignments, projects and practical tasks
- Studied at HE colleges







Higher and Degree Apprenticeships

- 80% on the job training; 20% in the classroom
- You earn a wage whilst gaining skills and qualifications
- One to six year qualification
- You must have a job/employer in order to undertake an apprenticeship.



• Example degree apprenticeships include: project management; digital & technology solutions; nuclear engineering, construction; surveying, and many more.





What's the difference?

Undergraduate Degree	Higher / Degree Apprenticeship	
Access to £9,2535 per year tuition fee loan	government and the company	
Gain a level 6 qualification	Gain a level 4-7 qualification	
Usually full-time study with variable contact time (some part-time options)	A minimum of 20% protected study time during contracted work hours	
Apply through UCAS	Apply through employer	
scholarships and loans for living	Paid	
Get the 'university experience'	Go straight into the world of work	
seminars and independent study, but can include laboratory work	Learn mainly on the job, but also through studies

Tuition Fee Loans

- You don't have to pay anything upfront
- Equivalent to your fee up to £9,535
- This loan is available to everyone & doesn't depend on your income
- Paid directly to your university/college





Maintenance Loan

- The maintenance loan is available to all full-time UK students, regardless of household income.
- Everyone is entitled to at least 44% of the loan (slightly more if you're living away from home). The remaining amount is 'income assessed' on household income.
- It is paid in three instalments





Maintenance Loan

Full-time student	Non-income assessed loan (2025 - 2026)	Maximum loan available (2025 - 2026)
Living at home	£3,907	Up to £8,877
Away from home, outside London	£4,915	Up to £10,544
Away from home, in London	£6,853	Up to £13,762
Spending a year of a UK course studying abroad	£5,838	Up to £12,076





Repayment does not begin until you earn over...

£25,000

You repay 9% of anything earned over this threshold





Repayments

- If your earnings fall, your contributions fall
- You can repay early
- You still have to repay if you move abroad
- Debt is written off after 40 years from the April after you leave university.

Annual Salary	income before	Monthly Repayment
Up to £25,000	£2,083	£0
£28,000	£2,333	£22.50
£30,000	£2,500	£37.50
£35,000	£2,916	£75
